OPENING COMMENTS

IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

Reason for closure: sewage overflow

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

The purpose of this visit is to respond to a complaint (CO# 0070113) received by this Agency. A joint inspection was conducted with M. Raymond (AEHS), also with this Agency. The complaint alleges that, sewage was overflowing onto the parking lot. The complaint was discussed with J. Reyes (General Manager). J. Reyes was aware of the complaint and stated that they first noticed the sewage overflow on the night of 3/2/2019 at approximately 7:45 pm. Per the L. Hornik (Huntington Beach Public Works), the exact time of the sewage spill was undetermined. The sewage originated in the rear of the restaurant and flowed through the parking lot gutters to the sewers. Upon arrival, the sewage overflow was no longer active and L Hornik stated that the main line had been cleared. Observed sewage residue pooled in the parking lot, gutters, and in front of the sidewalks on the west side of the restaurant. Sewage residue was also observed on the sidewalks and grass on the east side of the restaurant. Observed a whitish residue on the floor throughout the restaurant. In order to reinstate the permit clean and sanitize all affected areas within the facility. Also please ensure that all impacted areas outside the facility have been cleaned up using approved methods.

23. SEWAGE AND WASTEWATER PROPERLY DISPOSED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Observed sewage residue pooled in the parking lot, gutters, and in front of the sidewalks on the west side of the restaurant. Sewage residue was also observed on the sidewalks and grass on the east side of the restaurant. Observed a whitish residue on the floor throughout the restaurant. The sewage originated in the rear of the restaurant and flowed through the parking lot gutters to the sewers. Photos were taken this date.

Violation Description: All liquid waste must drain to an approved fully functioning sewage disposal system; toilets shall be operable. (114197)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2019 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: Sewage overflow

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
