Continued operation of the food business by any person after issuance of this Notice could result in a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

The Health Permit is hereby reinstated after the payment of \$827.50 was received by this office.  
You may now re-open for business.
