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OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit was to conduct a routine inspection. On this date the health permit was suspended due to rodent activity in critical areas. Refer to FM 24 and FM 50.

TO REOPEN YOUR FACILITY:

1. Eliminate the vermin (cockroach/rodent/etc.) activity through approved methods only.
2. Seal all gaps/cracks/crevices throughout the facility including but not limited to those listed below.
3. If using a pest control service, only re-enter the facility indicated on your pest control invoice and/or report.
4. Correct all violations noted on this report.
5. Call your inspector during normal business hours to request a re-inspection or call the after-hours (after 5 pm) number and leave a message for the on-call inspector.

6. HANDS CLEAN AND PROPERLY WASHED; GLOVES USED PROPERLY - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: Observed an employee touch a soiled wiping cloth then touch slices of bread without washing their hands first.

Corrective action: The employee was instructed to wash their hands and the bread was discarded. Refer to FM14 and FM53.

All food and utensil handlers shall wash their hands and arms thoroughly by vigorously rubbing them using a cleanser and warm running water for at least 10 -15 seconds after committing an unsanitary act.

Violation Description: Employees are required to wash their hands with soap and warm water for a minimum of 10 seconds: before beginning work; before handling food / equipment / utensils; as often as necessary, during food preparation, to remove soil and contamination; when switching from working with raw to ready-to-eat foods, after touching body parts; after using toilet room; or any time when contamination may occur. Food employees shall minimize contact with exposed, ready-to-eat food with their bare hands and shall use suitable utensils, gloves, or dispensing equipment. Food employees shall keep their fingernails clean. Gloves shall be worn if a food employee has artificial nails, nail polish, rings, or orthopedic support devices. (113952, 113953.3, 113953.4, 113961, 113968, 113973 [b-f])

14. FOOD IN GOOD CONDITION, SAFE AND UNADULTERATED - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: Observed an employee touch a soiled wiping cloth then touch slices of bread without washing their hands first.

Corrective action: The employee was instructed to wash their hands and the bread was discarded. Refer to FM06 and FM53.

Manufacture, produce, prepare, compound, pack, store, transport, keep for sale and serve food so as to be pure and free from contamination, adulteration and spoilage.

Violation Description: Any food is adulterated if it bears or contains an unapproved food or color additive or any poisonous or deleterious substance that may render it impure or injurious to health. No food containing artificial trans fat or partially-hydrogenated oils may be stored, distributed, served, or used in the preparation of any food within a food facility. Potentially hazardous foods in reduced oxygen packaging shall not exceed the "use by" date. (113967, 113976, 113980, 113982, 113988, 113990, 114035, 114041, 114094.5, 114254.3)

20. CONSUMER ADVISORY PROVIDED FOR RAW OR UNDERCOOKED FOODS - MINOR

Inspector Comments: Raw or undercooked animal products (beef steaks) are offered for sale and no consumer advisory is provided. Provide proper consumer advisory and reminder statements. See ocfoodinfo.com under Food for Thought and click on issue #3 for reference.

Violation Description: Ready-to-eat food containing undercooked food or raw egg may be served if the facility notifies the consumer by disclosure and reminder. (114012, 114093)



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24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: Observed rodent activity in the following areas:

- 1 rodent dropping on the floor under the 2-compartment sink in the kitchen
- numerous rodent droppings on the floor under the 3-compartment sink in the bar
- numerous rodent droppings in a white cabinet located near the front entrance

Eliminate the infestation of rodents from the food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

28. FOOD SEPARATED AND PROTECTED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Observed raw veal stored above ready-to-eat foods in the under-counter refrigerator at the cook's line. Store ready-to-eat foods above or separately from raw animal products.

Violation Description: All food shall be separated and protected from contamination. (113980, 113984, 113986, 114060, 114067, 114077, 114073, 114143)

30. TOXIC SUBSTANCES PROPERLY IDENTIFIED, STORED, USED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Observed unlabeled chemical spray bottles on the drain board of the dish machine area and on the shelf under the dish machine.

Working containers used for storing chemicals such as cleaners and sanitizers taken from bulk supplies shall be clearly and individually identified with the common name of the material.

Violation Description: All poisonous substances, detergents, bleaches, and cleaning compounds shall be stored separate from food, utensils, packaging materials, and food-contact surfaces, and shall be used in an approved manner. (114254, 114254.1, 114254.2)

34. NONFOOD-CONTACT SURFACES CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Remove the accumulation of black residue from the sealant on the 2-compartment sink/wall juncture.

Violation Description: All nonfood-contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean. (114115 [c])

37. EQUIPMENT, UTENSILS AND LINENS: STORAGE AND USE - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

- Inspector Comments:
- 1) Observed dish racks stored on the floor under the dish machine drain board.
 - 2) Observed a spatula stored in the crevice between the griddle and 2-compartment sink.

Clean and sanitize the equipment and store in an approved area to prevent possible contamination.

- 3) Observed utensils stored in a container of sitting water (120F) on the griddle.

Store in-use utensils that are used with potentially hazardous food in a sanitary container and clean the utensils at least every four hours, or in a container of water if the water is maintained at a temperature of at least 135F, or in running water of sufficient velocity to flush particulates to the drain if used with moist food such as ice cream or mashed potatoes.

Violation Description: All clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces. Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored so as to be protected from contamination. (114074, 114081, 114119, 114121, 114161, 114178, 114179, 114083, 114185, 114185.2, 114185.3, 114185.4, 114185.5)



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40. WIPING CLOTHS: PROPERLY USED AND STORED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Although sanitizer buckets were set up, multi-use wiping cloths were observed stored outside of the bucket. Discontinue holding multi-use wiping cloths outside of the sanitizer solution between uses. Store wiping cloths in an approved sanitizer solution (e.g., 100 ppm chlorine, 200 ppm quaternary ammonium or 25 ppm iodine) between uses, or provide a clean cloth for each use.

Violation Description: Wiping cloths used to wipe service counters, scales, or other surfaces that may come into contact with food shall be used only once unless kept in clean water with sanitizer; separate sanitizing containers shall be provided for wiping cloths used with raw animal foods. (114135, 114185.1 114185.3 [d-e])

44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Properly rodent proof the following areas:
- hole on the wall under the Perrier beverages in the wine storage room area
- the gaps on the ceiling above the exhaust hood at the cook's line

Seal all gaps that are greater than a 1/4 inch.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. (114067(j), 114123, 114143(a)&(b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282)

45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: 1) Observed exposed plywood under the dish machine drain board area. Repair the wall with one that is smooth, durable, and easily cleanable.

2) Clean and sanitize the affected areas noted in FM24.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted on this report, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2020 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

The CLOSED notification seal was issued this date.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: Rodent droppings in critical areas. Refer to FM24 and FM44.

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)

53. VOLUNTARY CONDEMNATION & DESTRUCTION (VC&D)

Inspector Comments: 1 loaf of bread

Violation Description: Food, equipment, or utensils that are found to be unsanitary or in disrepair may be Voluntarily Condemned and Destroyed by the person in charge. (111890, 111895)
