Items noted below were observed during the course of this inspection. Any violations observed must be corrected. Failure to correct the listed violation(s) prior to the designated compliance date may necessitate a reinspection at an additional fee.

Inspector Comments: This report supersedes the hand-written report left onsite this date. This report will be emailed to the person in charge, S. Gandhi.

This visit was at the request of the facility operator, to determine if the health permit could be reinstated after suspension for cockroach and rodent infestation.

The health permit was reinstated this date. The Reinspection-Pass seal was posted.

Violation Description:

24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS

Inspector Comments: 1. Some rodent droppings were observed at the front service counter under the rice cooker, and at the dry storage area in a linen box. The operator claimed these were left over and missed when they did their cleaning after permit suspension.

2. A couple dead cockroaches were observed on the wall under the food preparation sink, on the left where the sink is up against the wall.

The rodent droppings were removed and the area under the rice cooker cleaned and sanitized. The box of linens was removed outside and the linens placed in the dirty linen hamper. The dead cockroaches were removed and the area cleaned and sanitized.

A thorough inspection of areas noted with infestation was conducted, no other evidence of rodent or cockroach activity observed. A receipt for pest control service performed on 6/8/2018 was available. The areas were observed to be clean, the operator stated he had cleaned and sanitized all affected areas prior to this visit. A general review of the entire facility was conducted, no other evidence found.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

Inspector Comments: A reinspection has been scheduled for 6/29/18 to ensure no further evidence of cockroach or rodent activity is found.

Continue to keep the facility clean and sanitized. Seal any remaining gaps, cracks or holes not found during this inspection, and monitor daily for rodent and cockroach activity. Keep doors closed.

Violation Description:

Inspector Comments: 1. Observed the front door to not close completely when unlocked, leaving a gap about three inches wide at the bottom where rodents could enter. When the door is locked and secured, the gap is eliminated.

The operator was shown this gap, and stated he would immediately adjust the door closure to make the door swing completely closed.

2. Observed some small gaps in the ceiling around pipe penetrations in the front and back areas. The operator was directed to seal these gaps.
