Upon arrival the sewage debris including toilet papers were still noted on the ground in front of the facility. It appeared that the sewage debris was washed and the sewage was run down on the grass near the storm drain.

Discontinue washing and using chemicals to clean. This is not an approved manner to clean. Use an an approved method as discussed or a service company who is familiar with sewage clean-up process.

Unable to reinstate the Health Permit this date. You must remain closed until a representative at this Agency has authorized to re-open you.
