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OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit was to conduct a routine inspection. A complaint investigation was also conducted this date, see C01 report for more information.

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IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

REASON FOR CLOSURE:
Rodent activity

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

To reopen immediately correct the following:

- 1) Eliminate all rodent evidence from the affected areas noted in FM24
- 2) Use an approved method of pest control and provide an invoice detailing the measures that were performed and reentry time
- 3) Clean and sanitize all affected surfaces
- 4) Seal the gaps and/or crevices noted in FM 44 and FM45
- 5) Correct all violations cited on this report.

8. PROPER HOT AND COLD HOLDING TEMPERATURES - MINOR

Inspector Comments:

A cold top insert of sliced tomatoes was measured at 44 F at the cook's line; the person-in-charge (PIC) stated the food had been held for 3 hours. This violation was corrected when the food prep employee was instructed to relocate the insert of tomatoes to the walk-in cooler, but the PIC voluntarily discarded the tomatoes.

Violation Description: Potentially hazardous foods shall be held at or below 41°F or at or above 135°F. (113996, 113998, 114037, 114343(a), 114004)

Corrected on site

24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR

Inspector Comments:

1. One live cockroach was identified on the floor of the cutting board utensil storage area. This violation was corrected when a food prep employee eliminated the cockroach. A thorough inspection for vermin activity was conducted. No further evidence was observed. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects.

2. Several rodent droppings were identified on the second floor of the food prep area at the following areas :

- 1) on the floor behind the bread oven
- 2) on the floor and to the left of the soda syrup station

Eliminate the activity of rodents from the food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of rodents and insects (also see FM44 and FM45).

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)



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36. EQUIPMENT/UTENSILS - APPROVED; INSTALLED; GOOD REPAIR; CAPACITY - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Repair or replace the door gasket for the beer cooler observed torn and in disrepair, located at the bar.

Violation Description: All utensils and equipment shall be fully operative and in good repair. All utensils and equipment shall be approved, installed properly, and meet applicable standards. (114130, 114130.1, 114130.2, 114130.3, 114130.4, 114130.5, 114130.6, 114132, 114133, 114137, 114139, 114153, 114155, 114163, 114165, 114167, 114169, 114175, 114177, 114180, 114182)

44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

1. Discontinue using cardboard as a placemat for cleaning solutions observed next to the bar warewashing machine, as it can be a harborage area for vermin.

2. Seal/repair the holes and cracks observed in the following areas to prevent the entry and harborage of vermin:
- crack observed between the metal plate and wall underneath the hanwash sink at the cook's line
 - small hole on the wall on the bottom left side of the door frame in the cutting board utensil storage area
 - two holes in the ceiling in the soda syrup room where the electrical cords are located

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. (114067(j), 114123, 114143(a)&(b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282)

45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

1. Seal the metal plate to the wall observed cracked underneath the hanwash sink at the cook's line.
2. Seal the small hole on the wall on the bottom left side of the door frame in the cutting board utensil storage area.
3. Seal the two holes in the ceiling in the soda syrup room where the electrical cords are located.
4. Repair the base coving observed cracked underneath the food prep table in the ice machine room.
5. Remove the ice build up observed on the floor of the walk-in freezer to maintain floor surfaces smooth and easily cleanable.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

REASON FOR CLOSURE:

Rodent activity

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
