The purpose of this visit is to conduct a follow-up inspection to reopen the facility. This was requested by J. Rivera, employee of the facility.

On this visit, the following was observed:

- all evidence of the infestation was cleared and sanitized
- all gaps greater than 1/4 inch were sealed
- the scrubs were removed from the hand washing sink

A receipt for pest control dated 9-19-19 was provided on this date. The reason for closure has been corrected and the permit will be re-instated.

A follow-up inspection has been scheduled for 9-27-19 to recheck for rodent activity.
