OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit at request of the manager, C. Deleon, is to follow up on violation #24 which caused the closure of this facility on 01/21/2020. On this date, the manager provided the pest control report on 01/21/2020. No further live/dead cockroaches were observed this date. Also, all violations had been corrected except violations #02, #20, #36 (for gaskets of coolers and non-NSF equipment removal), and #45 (for repairing cove tiles). These violations must be corrected prior to the next routine inspection. The Health Permit is hereby reinstated. A 3-week reinspection after the reopening will be on 02/13/2020 to follow up on elimination of cockroach activity in this facility.
