OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit was to conduct a reinspection of the violations noted on the 03/26/2019 routine inspection report. Noted pest control service receipt dated 03/29/2019.

The permit of this facility is suspended as this date.

IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

REASON FOR CLOSURE: Cockroach activity in critical areas.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

To reopen immediately correct the following:

- 1) Eliminate all cockroach evidence from the affected areas noted in data FM 24
- 2) Use an approved method of pest control and provide an invoice detailing the measures that were performed and re-entry time
- 3) Clean and sanitize all affected utensils and surfaces
- 4) Correct all of the violations listed below:

7. ADEQUATE HANDWASHING FACILITIES SUPPLIED & ACCESSIBLE - MINOR

Inspector Comments: Observed paper towels stored outside of the dispenser at the hand wash sink in the employees restroom. Maintain single-use sanitary towels in dispensers (or hot air blowers) at, or adjacent to, all handwashing facilities.

Violation Description: Handwashing facilities must be provided. Handwashing soap and single-use towels or drying device shall be provided in dispensers; dispensers shall be maintained in good repair. Handwashing facilities shall be clean, unobstructed, and accessible. (113953, 113953.1, 113953.2, 114067)



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24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: 1. Observed several live cockroaches in the mechanical motor area under the Nantucket Nectar drink cooler at the entrance to the meat department line.

2. Observed several dead cockroaches in the following areas:
- in the mechanical motor area under the Nantucket Nectar drink cooler
 - in the mechanical motor area under the Arctic Air freezer
 - on the inner door frame of the Nantucket Nectar drink cooler
 - on the floor underneath the meat display case

3. Observed a few rodent droppings in the back storage room near the back entry door. No food or food related equipment is stored in this room. Only paper goods, detergents, and other non-food grocery items were stored in this room. A thorough inspection for rodents was conducted of the facility and no further evidence of rodents was observed.

Eliminate the infestation/activity of cockroaches/rodents/vermin from the food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects. (Also see FM 44).

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Observed the front door propped open during the course of inspection. Maintain the door closed at all times to prevent vermin entrance.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. (114067(j), 114123, 114143(a)&(b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282)

45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Remove the accumulation of debris on the ground in the small storage room next to the employee restroom. Maintain the facility in a clean and sanitary manner.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code.

The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2019 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: Cockroach activity

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
