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OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit is to conduct a routine inspection.

On this date the Health Permit has been suspended due to a rodent infestation in critical areas.

14. FOOD IN GOOD CONDITION, SAFE AND UNADULTERATED - MAJOR

Inspector Comments:

Observed a candy bar on the shelf that was opened and bitten. The person in charge voluntarily discarded the candy bar.

Violation Description: Any food is adulterated if it bears or contains an unapproved food or color additive or any poisonous or deleterious substance that may render it impure or injurious to health. No food containing artificial trans fat or partially-hydrogenated oils may be stored, distributed, served, or used in the preparation of any food within a food facility. Potentially hazardous foods in reduced oxygen packaging shall not exceed the "use by" date. (113967, 113976, 113980, 113982, 113988, 113990, 114035, 114041, 114094.5, 114254.3)

24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR

Inspector Comments:

Observed rodent droppings in the following locations:

- on the floor next to the far left aisle between boxes of beverages stored on the floor
- on the floor next to the aisle closest to the display coolers along the back walls
- on the floor below the third shelf from the left of the facility
- on the candy shelf
- in the space between the display coolers and the wall

Eliminate the infestation of rodents from the food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

31. FOOD STORAGE; FOOD STORAGE CONTAINERS IDENTIFIED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Observed open boxes and containers of bulk food items and beverages stored directly on the floor throughout the facility. Once the packaging is opened, maintain all items 6 inches off the floor.

Violation Description: Food shall be stored in approved containers and labeled as to its contents. Food shall be stored at least 6" above the floor on approved shelving and in an approved area. (114047, 114049, 114051, 114053, 114055, 114067(h), 114069 [b])

34. NONFOOD-CONTACT SURFACES CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Remove the evidence of rodent activity from the shelf holding candy. Refer to item 24.

Violation Description: All nonfood-contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean. (114115 [c])



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37. EQUIPMENT, UTENSILS AND LINENS: STORAGE AND USE - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Remove all items from the facility which are unnecessary to the operation or maintenance of the facility.

Violation Description: All clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces. Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored so as to be protected from contamination. (114074, 114081, 114119, 114121, 114161, 114178, 114179, 114083, 114185, 114185.2, 114185.3, 114185.4, 114185.5)

44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Properly rodent proof the interior/exterior of the premises. Seal all gaps that are greater than a 1/4 inch, including but not limited to the holes in the ceiling around the electrical conduit lines above the display coolers.

* It was discussed with the person in charge that they should move the display coolers away from the wall and check for gaps greater than 1/4 inch behind them.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. (114067(j), 114123, 114143(a)&(b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282)

45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

1. Clean to remove all evidence of rodent activity on the floors. Refer to item 24.

2. Remove the accumulation of dust and debris behind and in between equipment throughout the facility.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2019 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: rodent infestation in critical areas

Prior to calling for a reopening inspection all violations on this report must be corrected and a pest control receipt must be provided.

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
