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OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit was to conduct a routine inspection.

As of June 18, 2018, partially hydrogenated oils (PHOs) are no longer recognized as safe for human consumption by Order of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Any food product containing PHOs or trans fats used as a food ingredient must be discontinued and removed from the food facility. Refer to ocfoodinfo.com for further information.

2. FOOD MANAGER CERTIFICATION; FOOD HANDLER CARDS

Inspector Comments:

-There has been a change in manager. You have 60 days to provide this agency with a valid food manager card.

Violation Description: There shall be a Food Manager Certificate on the premises for the designated employee that has passed an approved and accredited exam. Food facilities that prepare, handle, or serve non-prepackaged food, shall ensure that all food handlers have an approved food handler card. (113947.1-113947.5, 113948)

7. ADEQUATE HANDWASHING FACILITIES SUPPLIED & ACCESSIBLE - MINOR

Inspector Comments:

Observed a beer keg to be blocking the hand wash sink located adjacent to the three compartment sink. Remove the obstruction.

Violation Description: Handwashing facilities must be provided. Handwashing soap and single-use towels or drying device shall be provided in dispensers; dispensers shall be maintained in good repair. Handwashing facilities shall be clean, unobstructed, and accessible. (113953, 113953.1, 113953.2, 114067)

24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR

Inspector Comments:

1. Observed a dead cockroach in the nonfunctional cooler located underneath the alcoholic beverage glass door cooler.
2. Observed multiple live cockroaches located behind the beer dispensing cooler in the cashiers area.
3. Observed multiple dead cockoraches on the floor beneath the beer dispensing cooler in the cashiers area.

Eliminate the infestation/activity of cockroaches/rodents/flies/vermin from the food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

31. FOOD STORAGE; FOOD STORAGE CONTAINERS IDENTIFIED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Observed several unlabeled salt/spices containers. Working containers holding food or food ingredients that are removed from their original packages for use in the food facility, such as cooking oils, flour, herbs, potato flakes, salt, spices, and sugar, shall be identified with the common name of the food, except containers holding food that can be readily and unmistakably recognized, such as dry pasta, need not be identified.

Violation Description: Food shall be stored in approved containers and labeled as to its contents. Food shall be stored at least 6" above the floor on approved shelving and in an approved area. (114047, 114049, 114051, 114053, 114055, 114067(h), 114069 [b])



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34. NONFOOD-CONTACT SURFACES CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

1. Observed the 3-door cooler located across the pizza oven to have an accumulation of food debris. Clean and sanitize the cooler.
2. Observed an accumulation of debris in the gaskets of all the 3-door coolers located in the pizza assembly line. Clean and sanitize the gaskets.
3. Observed an accumulation of trash, food, and/or debris on the floor in the following areas:
 - on the floor behind the 3-door coolers located in the pizza assembly line
 - on the floors and walls behind the cooler in disrepair
 - on the floors and walls behind the beer dispensing cooler
 - on the floors of the warewashing line
 - on the floors underneath the upright cooler located adjacent to the office space

Violation Description: All nonfood-contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean. (114115 [c])

37. EQUIPMENT, UTENSILS AND LINENS: STORAGE AND USE - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

1. Observed knives in use being stored on soiled towel. Discontinue this practice. The corrective action was to have the employee place the knives in the dirty dishes to be properly sanitized. Education on proper in-use utensil storage was provided. Store in-use utensils that are used with potentially hazardous food in a sanitary container and clean the utensils at least every four hours, or in a container of water if the water is maintained at a temperature of at least 135F, or in running water of sufficient velocity to flush particulates to the drain if used with moist food such as ice cream or mashed potatoes.
2. Observed several bulk dispenser scoops being stored in an unsanitary manner. Store the scoop in a sanitary, cleanable container or inside the ice bin in a manner that does not allow the handle to come into contact with the food. Clean the scoop regularly.

Violation Description: All clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces. Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored so as to be protected from contamination. (114074, 114081, 114119, 114121, 114161, 114178, 114179, 114083, 114185, 114185.2, 114185.3, 114185.4, 114185.5)

40. WIPING CLOTHS: PROPERLY USED AND STORED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

1. Although sanitizer buckets were set up, multi-use wiping cloths were observed stored outside of the bucket. Discontinue holding multi-use wiping cloths outside of the sanitizer solution between uses. Store wiping cloths in an approved sanitizer solution (e.g., 100 ppm chlorine, 200 ppm quaternary ammonium or 25 ppm iodine) between uses, or provide a clean cloth for each use.
2. Observed towels being stored in sanitizer buckets to not be fully submerged while in use. Ensure the towels in the buckets are fully submerged to allow for proper sanitation.

Violation Description: Wiping cloths used to wipe service counters, scales, or other surfaces that may come into contact with food shall be used only once unless kept in clean water with sanitizer; separate sanitizing containers shall be provided for wiping cloths used with raw animal foods. (114135, 114185.1 114185.3 [d-e])



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41. PLUMBING; PROPER BACKFLOW DEVICES - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Observed the handwash sink in the pizza assembly line to not be functioning. Repair the hand wash sink. The work around to this violation was to have the employees use the functioning hand wash sink located adjacent to the three compartment sink.

Violation Description: The potable water supply shall be protected with a backflow protection device, as required by applicable plumbing codes. All plumbing, plumbing fixtures, and grease interceptors shall be installed in compliance with local plumbing ordinances, shall be maintained so as to prevent any contamination, and shall be kept clean, fully operative, and in good repair. Any hose used for conveying potable water shall be of approved materials, labeled, properly stored, and used for no other purpose. (14171, 114189.1, 114190, 114192, 114193, 114193.1, 114199, 114201, 114269)

44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

1. Observed holes, cracks, and/or crevices in the following areas:

- in the wall behind the beer dispensing cooler
- in the wall behind non-functioning cooler
- in the crevice between the wall and the metal framing behind the non-functioning cooler
- in the wall behind the self service soda dispenser

Seal all gaps that are greater than a 1/4 inch

2. Observed several mop not in-use stored in a manner as to not allow for proper air-dry. Store all mop in areas as to allow proper air-drying.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. (114067(j), 114123, 114143(a)&(b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282)

45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments:

Observed a missing tile located in the pillar between the cooler in disrepair and the beer dispensing cooler. Replace the missing tile.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2019 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

The CLOSED notification seal was issued this date.

REASON FOR CLOSURE:

Cockroach infestation

All violations must be completed in full for the facility health permit to be reinstated by a representative of this Agency.

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
