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**OPENING COMMENTS**

The purpose of this visit is to conduct a routine inspection. Due to a rodent infestation, the health permit has been suspended at this time. Refer to violation FM24 and FM50.

Prior to calling for a reinspection correct all of the following items:

1. Eliminate all evidence of rodent activity (refer to #24).
2. Clean and sanitize all affected areas
3. Seal the gaps and/or crevices and eliminate harborage and entrance points including but not limited to the areas noted under violation FM44

**1. DEMONSTRATION OF KNOWLEDGE - MINOR**

Inspector Comments:

The person in charge was unable to demonstrate adequate knowledge in warewashing.

Violation Description: All food employees, including the person in charge, shall have adequate knowledge of and be trained in food safety as it relates to their assigned duties. (113947)

**7. ADEQUATE HANDWASHING FACILITIES SUPPLIED & ACCESSIBLE - MINOR**

Inspector Comments:

Refill the soap dispenser adjacent at the hand washing sink adjacent to the three compartment sink

Violation Description: Handwashing facilities must be provided. Handwashing soap and single-use towels or drying device shall be provided in dispensers; dispensers shall be maintained in good repair. Handwashing facilities shall be clean, unobstructed, and accessible. (113953, 113953.1, 113953.2, 114067)

**15. FOOD CONTACT SURFACES: CLEAN AND SANITIZED - MAJOR**

Inspector Comments:

Sanitizer was unavailable at this facility and is unable to properly wash, rinse, and sanitize multi use equipment.

Violation Description: All food contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean and sanitized. (113984(d), 114097, 114099.1, 114099.4, 114099.6, 114101(b-d), 114105, 114109, 114111, 114113, 114115(a, b, d), 114117, 114125(b), 114141)

**24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR**

Inspector Comments:

1. Observed rodent activity at the following locations:

- Rodent droppings and urine throughout the cabinet below the soda dispenser
- Rodent droppings at the window sill above the ice chest closest near the beverage storage shelves
- Rodent urine and knawed sunflower seeds on the floors underneath a food rack in the customer area

Remove the evidence of rodent activity and clean and sanitize all affected areas.

2. Observed one dead adult cockroach in the cabinet below the coffee island. Remove the cockroach and clean and sanitize the affected area. No further evidence of cockroach activity was observed at this time.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

**34. NONFOOD-CONTACT SURFACES CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Remove/clean the accumulation of grime/debris from the cabinets below the coffee bar, soda machine, and ice machine

Violation Description: All nonfood-contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean. (114115 [c])



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**35. WAREWASHING FACILITIES: INSTALLED, MAINTAINED, USED; TEST STRIPS - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Sanitizer test strips were not available for use during the time of inspection. Maintain testing equipment and materials in the facility and available for use at all times for the purpose of adequately measuring the types of sanitization methods used in this facility.

Violation Description: Food facilities that prepare food shall be equipped with warewashing facilities. Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the applicable sanitization method. (114067(f,g), 114099, 114099.3, 114099.5, 114101(a), 114101.1, 114101.2, 114103, 114107, 114125)

**36. EQUIPMENT/UTENSILS - APPROVED; INSTALLED; GOOD REPAIR; CAPACITY - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Repair the broken cabinet door below the coffee station

Violation Description: All utensils and equipment shall be fully operative and in good repair. All utensils and equipment shall be approved, installed properly, and meet applicable standards. (114130, 114130.1, 114130.2, 114130.3, 114130.4, 114130.5, 114130.6, 114132, 114133, 114137, 114139, 114153, 114155, 114163, 114165, 114167, 114169, 114175, 114177, 114180, 114182)

**37. EQUIPMENT, UTENSILS AND LINENS: STORAGE AND USE - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

1. Secure the CO2 cylinders adjacent to the soda syrup racks to a rigid structure

2. Discontinue storing the single use cup boxes on the floor near the ice machine. Maintain the boxes elevated a minimum of 6 inches above the floor

Violation Description: All clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces. Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored so as to be protected from contamination. A full service restaurant is to only provide a single-use plastic straw to a consumer when requested. (114074, 114081, 114119, 114121, 114161, 114178, 114179, 114083, 114185, 114185.2, 114185.3, 114185.4, 114185.5)

**44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Seal the gaps around the two vertical pipes above the reach in ice chest freezer near the front window to prevent the entrance of rodents

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. (114067(j), 114123, 114143(a)&(b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282)

**45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Remove/clean the accumulation of grime/debris from the following locations:

- The floors below the janitorial sink
- The floors below the soda racks
- The floor sink below the ice machine

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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**50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD**

Inspector Comments:  
**IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE**

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted on this report, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2020 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

REASON FOR CLOSURE:  
Rodent infestation

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
