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OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit is to conduct a routine inspection.

Health Permit Suspended on this date (refer to #50)

1. DEMONSTRATION OF KNOWLEDGE

Inspector Comments: The following topics were discussed on this date:

- a. proper hot and cold holding
- b. proper wash, rinse and sanitizing of multi-use utensils were discussed and demonstrated on site this date

Violation Description: All food employees, including the person in charge, shall have adequate knowledge of and be trained in food safety as it relates to their assigned duties. (113947)

2. FOOD MANAGER CERTIFICATION; FOOD HANDLER CARDS

Inspector Comments: A valid Food Manager Certificate was not available for review at the time of the inspection. Provide an approved food manager certificate.

Violation Description: There shall be a Food Manager Certificate on the premises for the designated employee that has passed an approved and accredited exam. Food facilities that prepare, handle, or serve non-prepackaged food, shall ensure that all food handlers have an approved food handler card. (113947.1-113947.5, 113948)

7. ADEQUATE HANDWASHING FACILITIES SUPPLIED & ACCESSIBLE

Inspector Comments: 1. A pitcher container for the blender was observed being stored in the facility hand sink not allowing access for proper hand washing. Discontinue this practice of storing items in the hand sink or for anything other than proper hand washing. Maintain all hand washing sinks fully operative, in good repair and easily accessible.

2. Refill the empty paper towel dispenser located at the kitchen hand sink.

Provide and maintain handwashing soap and single-use sanitary towels in dispensers (or hot air blowers) at, or adjacent to, all handwashing facilities.

Violation Description: Handwashing facilities must be provided. Handwashing soap and single-use towels or drying device shall be provided in dispensers; dispensers shall be maintained in good repair. Handwashing facilities shall be clean, unobstructed, and accessible. (113953, 113953.1, 113953.2, 114067)

8. PROPER HOT AND COLD HOLDING TEMPERATURES

Inspector Comments: A container of milk measured at 57F located in the under counter reach in cooler for an underdetermined amount of time. Maintain the temperature of potentially hazardous foods at or below 41F degrees Fahrenheit or at or above 135 degrees Fahrenheit.

Violation corrected by an employee discarding the food. See Voluntary Condemnation and Destruction (#53).

Violation Description: Potentially hazardous foods shall be held at or below 41°F or at or above 135°F. (113996, 113998, 114037, 114343(a), 114004)

22. HOT AND COLD WATER AVAILABLE

Inspector Comments: The hot water measured at 72F located at the 3 compartment sink. Provide hot potable water under pressure of at least 120F available at all times at the 3-compartment sink.

Violation Description: An adequate, protected, pressurized, potable supply of hot water and cold water shall be provided at all times. (113941, 113953c, 114099.2b, 114163, 114189, 114192, 114192.1, 114195)



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30. TOXIC SUBSTANCES PROPERLY IDENTIFIED, STORED, USED

Inspector Comments: Label all chemical spray bottles as to their contents.

Violation Description: All poisonous substances, detergents, bleaches, and cleaning compounds shall be stored separate from food, utensils, packaging materials, and food-contact surfaces, and shall be used in an approved manner. (114254, 114254.1, 114254.2)

35. WAREWASHING FACILITIES: INSTALLED, MAINTAINED, USED; TEST STRIPS

Inspector Comments: Sanitizer test strips were not available for use during the time of inspection. Maintain testing equipment and materials in the facility and available for use at all times for the purpose of adequately measuring the types of sanitization methods used in this facility.

Violation Description: Food facilities that prepare food shall be equipped with warewashing facilities. Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the applicable sanitization method. (114067(f,g), 114099, 114099.3, 114099.5, 114101(a), 114101.1, 114101.2, 114103, 114107, 114125)

36. EQUIPMENT/UTENSILS - APPROVED; INSTALLED; GOOD REPAIR; CAPACITY

Inspector Comments: 1. Cardboard boxes were observed being used as multi-use containers on the floor and reach in coolers.

Discontinue re-using unapproved containers, (i.e. single-use cans, styrofoam cups, crates, cardboard boxes, plastic grocery bags). After the food product has been opened, transfer the product into durable, washable, and cleanable working containers with lids.

2. The following Non Ansi/NSF pieces of equipment were observed on site this date:

- a. Jadesnow (milk shaving machine)
- b Black and decker toaster oven

Equipment and utensils must be commercial grade and approved by ANSI, or another testing company certified by American National Standards Institute or by this Agency.

Violation Description: All utensils and equipment shall be fully operative and in good repair. All utensils and equipment shall be approved, installed properly, and meet applicable standards. (114130, 114130.1, 114130.2, 114130.3, 114130.4, 114130.5, 114130.6, 114132, 114133, 114137, 114139, 114153, 114155, 114163, 114165, 114167, 114169, 114175, 114177, 114180, 114182)

39. THERMOMETERS PROVIDED AND ACCURATE

Inspector Comments: A probe thermometer was not available for use during the time of inspection. A Temporary Food Facility at which potentially hazardous foods are present must provide a probe thermometer suitable for measuring the temperature of foods. Provide a readily available, easily readable metal probe thermometer accurate to plus or minus 2øF and with a range of at least 0øF to 220øF.

Violation Description: An accurate, easily readable metal probe thermometer suitable for measuring temperature of food shall be available. A thermometer +/- 2°F shall be provided for each hot and cold holding unit of potentially hazardous foods and high temperature warewashing machines. (114157, 114159)

45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN

Inspector Comments: Remove the accumulation of old food residue and debris from the floors in hard to reach places (underneath the refrigeration units, ware washing sink, remote storage room). Maintain the floor and floor sinks in a clean and sanitary manner.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2018 is \$44.63 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

The CLOSED notification seal was issued this date.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: Lack of Hot Water

PRIOR to Re-instating the Health Permit Ensure that the hot water temperature is at least 120F.

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)

53. VOLUNTARY CONDEMNATION & DESTRUCTION (VC&D)

Inspector Comments: Approximately:
1 gallon of milk

Violation Description: Food, equipment, or utensils that are found to be unsanitary or in disrepair may be Voluntarily Condemned and Destroyed by the person in charge. (111890, 111895)
