Items noted below were observed during the course of this inspection. Any violations observed must be corrected. Failure to correct the listed violation(s) prior to the designated compliance date may necessitate a reinspection at an additional fee.

OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit is in response to a complaint of a sewage spill. The facility had a recent sewage spill that was responded to by this Agency on January 18, 2020.

On this date, evidence of a sewage spill in the parking lot was observed. Zoom Drain plumbing company was on-site. Steve Franks & Bill Tarin, City of Villa Park, were on-site. H. Elmishad, REHS Water Quality, & O. Campos, EHS, were also on-site. Spoke with Souzy, manager.

The manager stated that the employee noticed water at the clean-out line in the parking lot and called the plumbing service. Sean, Zoom Drain Plumbing, stated approximately 20 gallons of sewage came out of the clean-out line. The sewage ran from the parking lot into the bushes/flower bed of the main sidewalk by Santiago Blvd. No sewage appeared to go into the storm drain.

The facility's health permit was suspended due to the reoccurring sewage spill. (See FM23)

Prior to calling for a reinspection to reinstate the health permit, please ensure the following:

- Make all necessary repairs to the plumbing so as to stop the sewage spill.
- Clean and sanitize all affected areas of the sewage spill including the areas in the parking lot.
- Properly dispose of the contaminated material in an approved manner.
- Provide all necessary receipts/documentation to indicate the above items have been completed.

23. SEWAGE AND WASTEWATER PROPERLY DISPOSED - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: Observed the following items:

- Sewage and debris along the clean-out line in the westside parking lot of the facility
- Sewage and debris in the bushes/flower bed near the sidewalk closest to Santiago Blvd.

Repair and maintain all plumbing and plumbing fixtures fully operative, clean and in good repair so as to prevent contamination.

Violation Description: All liquid waste must drain to an approved fully functioning sewage disposal system; toilets shall be operable. (114197)

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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted on this report, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

To request a reinspection prior to 5:00 pm, please call (714) 433-6000. If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2020 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

REASON FOR CLOSURE:

Sewage spill

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
