OPENING COMMENTS

This visit was at the request of Rodolfo Cortez regarding no hot water in the facility that resulted in a health permit suspension on October 28, 2019. The hot water temperature reached a minimum of at least 120F at the 3-compartment sink and janitorial sink. The hot water temperature measured at least 100F at all handwash sinks.

The violations causing a health permit suspension have been corrected and this facility's health permit has been reinstated. Continue correcting all remaining violations.
