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OPENING COMMENTS

Routine inspection conducted.

15. FOOD CONTACT SURFACES: CLEAN AND SANITIZED - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: Observed rodent droppings on the serving platters and cake stand in the dry storage room. Remove the rodent droppings, clean and sanitize all contaminated food contact surfaces.

Violation Description: All food contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean and sanitized. (113984(d), 114097, 114099.1, 114099.4, 114099.6, 114101(b-d), 114105, 114109, 114111, 114113, 114115(a, b, d), 114117, 114125(b), 114141)

24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR

- Inspector Comments: Observed rodent droppings in the following areas:
- on the floor by the blue dish machine racks located in the dry storage room
 - below the storage rack in the back corner of the dry storage room
 - below the soda syrup rack in the dry storage room
 - on the serving platters and cake stands on the storage rack located in the dry storage room

 - on the floor below the upright cooler located by the handwash station
 - inside the motor housing of the upright cooler located by the handwash station

 - on the interior surface of the cabinet located below the prep sink by the kitchen entrance

Eliminate the activity of rodents from the food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects.

Corrective Action Taken: The health permit was suspended on this date, see FM 50.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

36. EQUIPMENT/UTENSILS - APPROVED; INSTALLED; GOOD REPAIR; CAPACITY - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: 1) Remove the rodent droppings, clean and sanitize the interior compartment surface below the prep sink located by the kitchen entrance door.

2) Observed the dish machine racks stored directly on the floor. Discontinue this practice.

Violation Description: All utensils and equipment shall be fully operative and in good repair. All utensils and equipment shall be approved, installed properly, and meet applicable standards. (114130, 114130.1, 114130.2, 114130.3, 114130.4, 114130.5, 114130.6, 114132, 114133, 114137, 114139, 114153, 114155, 114163, 114165, 114167, 114169, 114175, 114177, 114180, 114182)

44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

- Inspector Comments: Install an approved weather stripping below the back door to seal the gap.
Seal the gaps around the pipes located in the ceiling above the storage rack in the dry storage room.
Seal the gaps around the conduit lines for the ansel system located above the handwash station.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. 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45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: 1) Eliminate rodent droppings, clean and sanitize the floor surfaces in the following areas:

- below the soda syrup rack in the dry storage room
 - between/by the dish machine racks
 - below/behind the upright cooler located by the handwash sink
- 2) Eliminate the debris below the cabinets throughout the kitchen.
3) Replace the missing drain screens/domes within the floor sinks.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2019 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

The CLOSED notification seal was issued this date.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: RODENT INFESTATION

Prior to calling for a reinspection the following must be corrected:

- 1) Complete all violations on this report.
- 2) Clean and sanitize all surfaces to eliminate rodent contamination including, but not limited to, all prep tables, food equipment, food containers, shelves, and floors.
- 3) Properly eliminate/seal potential points of entry such as holes and gaps in the walls, basecoves, ceiling, and under all exterior doors to prevent vermin entrance.

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
