**OPENING COMMENTS**

The purpose of this visit is to conduct a complaint investigation( CO0072058) alleging that there are rodent droppings located at the entrance of the doors. On this date a thorough vermin inspection was conducted at the facility. The complaint was verified on this date. Furthermore, rodent evidence was observed in critical areas of the facility. The health permit was suspended on this date. A closure seal was issued and left on site.

Prior to calling this agency for reinspection to reinstate the health permit, please ensure the following:

- Eliminate the rodent activity
- Provide approved pest control methods( glue traps/ Snap trap)
- Clean and sanitize all affected areas
- Seal any gap/holes
- Correct all violations prior to calling for reopening.

**24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Observed rodent droppings in the following locations:

- Inside the cabinet located underneath the consumer self service soda machine
- On the floors near the trash can of the customer dining area
- On the floors underneath the customer self service soda machine
- On the counter behind the soda machine of the customers self service area
- On the floor underneath the bread station
- On the floor underneath the soda syrup rack of the back kitchen area
- On the floor underneath the dry food containers rack of the back kitchen area
- On a carboard box of apple sauce located on the dry food storage racks near the 3- compartment sink
- In the cabinet of the bread oven/microwave station
- In the empty space underneath the cold top serving station of the front counter

Eliminate the infestation of rodents from the food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects.

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

**44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Observed a gap greater than 1/4 inch in the front door entrance, in between the doors and on the bottom of the doors. Properly rodent proof the interior/exterior of the premises. Seal all gaps that are greater than a 1/4 inch.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. 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**45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

- Observed loose ceiling tiles located in the following area:
  - Around the walk-in cooler
 Adjust the ceiling panels to eliminate any gaps
- Observed holes and or crevices in the following areas:
  - In the ceiling tile above the water heater
  - In the wall where the piping is underneath the 3-compartment sink
  - In the back panel of the customer self service soda machine( where the tape is located)

Eliminate the gaps using approved materials( clean, durable, and easily cleanable)

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)

**50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD**

Inspector Comments:

IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted on this report, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2020 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time. REASON FOR CLOSURE:

Rodent Droppings

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
