Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE CLOSURE NOTICE FOR FOOD OPERATIONS WITHOUT A VALID HEALTH PERMIT

The above named food operation has been found open for business this date and operating without a valid health permit issued by Environmental Health. This is in violation of Section 114381 (a) of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 1 of the California Health and Safety Code. A food operation shall not open for business without a valid health permit . Any food operation that has been directed to close shall cease all food handling and sales activities until a health permit has been issued by a representative of Environmental Health. A person who is building or remodeling a food operation is required to submit plans and specifications to Environmental Health for review and approval and be in compliance with all requirements.

Continued operation of the food business by any person after issuance of this Notice could result in a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health. Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business if you have any questions regarding this action.

Violation Description: An enforcement officer may suspend or revoke the permit for non-compliance or for interference in the performance of the duty of the enforcement officer. (114405, 114409, 114411)
