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OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit was to conduct a routine inspection. The facility's health permit was suspended due to lack of hot water throughout the facility. Please see FM 22 and FM 50 for details.

22. HOT AND COLD WATER AVAILABLE - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: No hot water was available in the facility.

Violation Description: An adequate, protected, pressurized, potable supply of hot water and cold water shall be provided at all times. (113941, 113953c, 114099.2b, 114163, 114189, 114192, 114192.1, 114195)

30. TOXIC SUBSTANCES PROPERLY IDENTIFIED, STORED, USED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: A chemical spray bottle was observed in the facility without a label.

Violation Description: All poisonous substances, detergents, bleaches, and cleaning compounds shall be stored separate from food, utensils, packaging materials, and food-contact surfaces, and shall be used in an approved manner. (114254, 114254.1, 114254.2)

41. PLUMBING; PROPER BACKFLOW DEVICES - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Repair the leak coming from the faucet fixture at the mop sink.

Violation Description: The potable water supply shall be protected with a backflow protection device, as required by applicable plumbing codes. All plumbing, plumbing fixtures, and grease interceptors shall be installed in compliance with local plumbing ordinances, shall be maintained so as to prevent any contamination, and shall be kept clean, fully operative, and in good repair. Any hose used for conveying potable water shall be of approved materials, labeled, properly stored, and used for no other purpose. 43. TOILET FACILITIES: PROPERLY CONSTRUCTED, SUPPLIED, CLEANED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: Remove the dust from the ventilation fan cover located in the toilet.

Violation Description: Toilet facilities shall be maintained clean, sanitary, and in good repair. Toilet rooms shall be separated by a well-fitting self-closing door. Toilet tissue shall be provided in a permanently installed dispenser at each toilet. The number of toilet facilities shall be in accordance with local building and plumbing ordinances. Toilet facilities shall be provided for patrons: in establishments where there is onsite consumption of food; with more than 20,000 sq ft.; establishments offering on-site liquor consumption. 44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: 1. Discontinue propping open the front door.
2. Gaps were observed the ceiling panels by the back door.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. 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52. PERMIT SUSPENSION

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted on this report, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

To request a reinspection prior to 5:00 pm, please call (714) 433-6000. If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2020 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

The CLOSED notification seal was issued this date.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: Lack of hot water throughout the facility.

Violation Description: An enforcement officer may suspend or revoke the permit for non-compliance or for interference in the performance of the duty of the enforcement officer. (114405, 114409, 114411)
