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**OPENING COMMENTS**

As of June 18, 2018, partially hydrogenated oils (PHOs) are no longer recognized as safe for human consumption by Order of the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Any food product containing PHOs or trans fats used as a food ingredient must be discontinued and removed from the food facility. Refer to [ocfoodinfo.com](http://ocfoodinfo.com) for further information.

**2. FOOD MANAGER CERTIFICATION; FOOD HANDLER CARDS - MINOR**

Inspector Comments:

A valid food handler card was not available from a randomly selected employee. Each food handler shall maintain a valid California Food Handler Card for the duration of his or her employment as a food handler. Cards shall be valid for three years from the date of issuance, regardless of whether the food handler changes employers during that period. (Certified Food Managers are exempted from this requirement.)

Violation Description: There shall be a Food Manager Certificate on the premises for the designated employee that has passed an approved and accredited exam. Food facilities that prepare, handle, or serve non-prepackaged food, shall ensure that all food handlers have an approved food handler card. (113947.1-113947.5, 113948)

**7. ADEQUATE HANDWASHING FACILITIES SUPPLIED & ACCESSIBLE - MINOR**

Inspector Comments:

Provide and maintain paper towels in the towel dispenser at the employee handwash sink.

Violation Description: Handwashing facilities must be provided. Handwashing soap and single-use towels or drying device shall be provided in dispensers; dispensers shall be maintained in good repair. Handwashing facilities shall be clean, unobstructed, and accessible. (113953, 113953.1, 113953.2, 114067)

**24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR**

Inspector Comments:

Observed numerous rodent droppings in the following areas throughout the facility:

- 1) On the floor underneath the 3 compartment sink.
- 2) The shelving in the corner adjacent to the reach-in cooler
- 3) The floors underneath the electronic equipment adjacent to the reach-in cooler
- 4) On the floors around the mop sink
- 5) The floors throughout the back storage rooms of the facility

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

**34. NONFOOD-CONTACT SURFACES CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

- 1) Clean the debris on the shelving underneath the prep tables.
- 2) Clean the debris throughout the shelving of the dry storage area located at the back of the facility.
- 3) Thoroughly clean the residue in the sliding door cooler located next to the employee handwash sink.
- 4) Clean and sanitize the shelving next to the reach-in prep cooler.

Violation Description: All nonfood-contact surfaces of utensils and equipment shall be clean. (114115 [c])



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**35. WAREWASHING FACILITIES: INSTALLED, MAINTAINED, USED; TEST STRIPS - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Quaternary ammonium sanitizer test strips were not available for use during the time of inspection. Maintain testing equipment and materials in the facility and available for use at all times for the purpose of adequately measuring the types of sanitization methods used in this facility.

Violation Description: Food facilities that prepare food shall be equipped with warewashing facilities. Testing equipment and materials shall be provided to measure the applicable sanitization method. (114067(f,g), 114099, 114099.3, 114099.5, 114101(a), 114101.1, 114101.2, 114103, 114107, 114125)

**37. EQUIPMENT, UTENSILS AND LINENS: STORAGE AND USE - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Utensils placed at the customer self-service station are being displayed in a manner that can result in contamination of lip contact surfaces.

Violation Description: All clean and soiled linen shall be properly stored; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces. Utensils and equipment shall be handled and stored so as to be protected from contamination. (114074, 114081, 114119, 114121, 114161, 114178, 114179, 114083, 114185, 114185.2, 114185.3, 114185.4, 114185.5)

**39. THERMOMETERS PROVIDED AND ACCURATE - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

A probe thermometer was not available for use during the time of inspection.

Violation Description: An accurate, easily readable metal probe thermometer suitable for measuring temperature of food shall be available. A thermometer +/- 2°F shall be provided for each hot and cold holding unit of potentially hazardous foods and high temperature warewashing machines. (114157, 114159)

**42. GARBAGE AND REFUSE PROPERLY DISPOSED; FACILITIES MAINTAINED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Observed the trash dumpster to be uncovered. Maintain dumpster closed to prevent the attraction and harborage of vermin and insects.

Violation Description: All food waste and rubbish shall be kept in leak-proof and rodent-proof containers. Containers shall be covered at all times. All waste must be removed and disposed of as frequently as necessary to prevent a nuisance. The exterior premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish. (114244, 114245, 114245.1, 114245.2, 114245.3, 114245.4, 114245.5, 114245.6, 114245.7, 114245.8)

**43. TOILET FACILITIES: PROPERLY CONSTRUCTED, SUPPLIED, CLEANED - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

Provide toilet tissue in a permanently installed dispensers at each toilet.

Violation Description: Toilet facilities shall be maintained clean, sanitary, and in good repair. Toilet rooms shall be separated by a well-fitting self-closing door. Toilet tissue shall be provided in a permanently installed dispenser at each toilet. The number of toilet facilities shall be in accordance with local building and plumbing ordinances. Toilet facilities shall be provided for patrons: in establishments where there is onsite consumption of food; with more than 20,000 sq ft.; establishments offering on-site liquor consumption. (114250, 114250.1, 114276)



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**44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

- 1) Seal the holes/replace the ceiling panels located above the oven.
- 2) Remove all items that are not necessary for the operation and maintenance of the facility.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. (114067(j), 114123, 114143(a)&(b), 114256, 114256.1, 114256.2, 114256.4, 114257, 114257.1, 114259, 114259.2, 114259.3, 114279, 114281, 114282)

**45. FLOORS, WALLS AND CEILINGS: BUILT, MAINTAINED, AND CLEAN - OUT OF COMPLIANCE**

Inspector Comments:

- 1) Remove the rodent droppings on floor underneath the 3 compartment sink.
- 2) Clean the residue build up in the walk-in cooler storing the keg coolers.
- 3) Remove the rodent droppings on the floors around the backroom mop sink.
- 4) Remove the rodent droppings on the floors throughout the backroom storage areas.
- 5) Clean the exhaust vents in the men's restroom.
- 6) Clean the accumulation of dust on the ceiling vents located above the oven and 3 compartment sink.

Violation Description: The walls / ceilings shall have durable, smooth, nonabsorbent, light-colored, and washable surfaces. All floor surfaces, other than the customer service areas, shall be approved, smooth, durable, and made of nonabsorbent material that is easily cleanable. Approved base coving shall be provided in all areas, except customer service areas and where food is stored in original unopened containers. Food facilities shall be fully enclosed. All food facilities shall be kept clean and in good repair. (114143(d), 114266, 114268, 114268.1, 114271, 114272)



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**50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD**

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2019 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

The CLOSED notification seal was issued this date.

**REASON FOR CLOSURE: RODENT INFESTATION**

Prior to calling for a reinspection the following must be addressed:

- 1) Correct all the violations noted on this report.
- 2) Clean and sanitize all areas, including the food equipment, floors, and food contact surfaces.
- 3) Seal potential points of entry, including the holes in the ceilings to prevent the entrance of vermin.

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
