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OPENING COMMENTS

The purpose of this visit is to conduct a routine inspection.

The Health Permit was Suspended on this date (Refer to FM 50).

24. NO RODENTS, INSECTS, BIRDS, OR ANIMALS - MAJOR

Inspector Comments: Live adult cockroaches were observed in the following locations:

a. underneath the counter top where the 2 ice cream chest freezers join together

Dead cockroaches were observed the floor below the area where the 2 freezer join together.

Eliminate the infestation/activity of cockroaches from the temporary food facility by using only approved methods. Remove all evidence of the infestation and thoroughly clean and sanitize all affected surfaces. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin including, but not limited to, rodents and insects (Refer to FM 50).

Violation Description: Each food facility shall be kept free of insects, birds, animals, or vermin: rodents (rats, mice), cockroaches, flies. (114259, 114259.1, 114259.4, 114259.5)

41. PLUMBING; PROPER BACKFLOW DEVICES - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: The ice cream drain pipes were observed positioned directly inside the floor sink. Elevate the drain pipes at least 1 inch above the floor sink to prevent cross contamination.

Violation Description: The potable water supply shall be protected with a backflow protection device, as required by applicable plumbing codes. All plumbing, plumbing fixtures, and grease interceptors shall be installed in compliance with local plumbing ordinances, shall be maintained so as to prevent any contamination, and shall be kept clean, fully operative, and in good repair. Any hose used for conveying potable water shall be of approved materials, labeled, properly stored, and used for no other purpose. 44. PREMISES: PERSONAL/CLEANING ITEMS; VERMIN-PROOFING - OUT OF COMPLIANCE

Inspector Comments: 1. Seal the cracks and crevices observed underneath the counter top where the 2 ice cream chest freezer are located. Construct, equip, maintain and operate the food facility so as to prevent the entrance and harborage of animals, birds and vermin, including, but not limited to, rodents and insects

2. Discontinue propping open the back door. Maintain the door closed at all times except during the times of passage.

Violation Description: The premises of each food facility shall be kept clean and free of litter and rubbish; non-food items shall be stored and displayed separate from food and food-contact surfaces; the facility shall be kept vermin proof; open-air barbecues shall be operated in an approved manner. 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50. PERMIT SUSPENSION - IMMINENT HEALTH HAZARD

Inspector Comments: IMMEDIATE HEALTH PERMIT SUSPENSION AND CLOSURE

The permit to operate the above named food facility is hereby temporarily suspended, and the facility is ordered immediately closed under the authority of Sections 114405 and 114409 of Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3 of the California Health and Safety Code. The attached Inspection Report specifies the conditions that warrant this closure and the Sections of the law that are being violated.

Any food facility for which the permit has been temporarily suspended shall cease all food handling, close and remain closed until all conditions warranting the closure are corrected and your permit has been reinstated by a representative of Environmental Health.

You are hereby notified that you have the right to request a hearing, within 15 calendar days after service of this Notice to show cause why the permit suspension is not warranted. Your failure to request a hearing within 15 calendar days shall be deemed a waiver of your right to a hearing.

An owner, manager or operator who fails to comply with this Closure Notice may be found guilty of a misdemeanor, with a possible fine of \$1,000.00 and/or imprisonment for not more than six months for each offense.

This Health Permit Suspension and Closure Notice is issued to you under the authority of the California Health and Safety Code, Division 104, Part 7, Chapter 13, Article 3. Copies of the Code Sections referred to herein may be reviewed at most public libraries, the Internet, or at Environmental Health.

Contact this office at the number noted above, during normal days of business to request a re-inspection, or if you have any questions.

If you are calling after 5:00 pm or on weekends, leave a message at (714) 433-6418 and an inspector/on call staff will call you back at their earliest convenience. Please make after hour request calls before 8:00 pm. The afterhours overtime rate through June 30, 2019 is \$45.75 per quarter hour, or fraction thereof; time charged includes all travel time.

The CLOSED notification seal was issued this date.

REASON FOR CLOSURE: Cockroach Activity

Prior to calling for a reinspection the following must be corrected:

- 1) Eliminate all live and dead cockroaches using approved pest control methods (refer to #24).
- 2) Remove all excess clutter and cardboard from the facility, as well as personal belongings, to allow for effective pest control service and to prevent future harborage of cockroaches and other vermin.
- 3) Clean and sanitize all equipment surfaces, food containers, shelves and floors to eliminate all cockroach and pesticide contamination particularly all areas where live or dead cockroaches or cockroach spotting were observed including, but not limited to, those areas listed in #24.
- 4) Properly eliminate/seal all cracks and crevices to prevent vermin harborage including but not limited to those listed in #44 & #45.
- 5) Whenever professional pest control services are used, you must have the pest control receipt available for review by the Environmental Health Specialist responding to your request for reinspection. Without proof that it is safe for the Specialist to enter your facility the reinspection will not occur. Enter your facility only after it is safe to do so.

Violation Description: If an imminent health hazard is found, an enforcement officer may temporarily suspend the permit and order the food facility immediately closed. (114409)
